Therefore, overcome with paschal joy, every land, every people exults in your praise and even the heavenly Powers, with the angelic hosts, sing together the unending hymn of your glory as they acclaim:

Holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The mystery of faith: We proclaim your Death, O Lord,

and profess your Resurrection

until you come again.

Communion Antiphon: The disciples recognised the Lord Jesus

in the breaking of the bread, alleluia.

Reflection: The wounds of love

Those who care about others pick up a lot of wounds. There may be no great wounds, only a multiplicity of little ones - a host of scratches, wrinkles and welts. But there can also be a lot of invisible wounds: the furrows left on the mind and the heart by hardship, worry and anxiety, disappointments, ingratitude, and betrayal. These wounds are not things to be ashamed of. They are badges of honour. They are the proof of our love. Jesus didn't hide his wounds. Neither should we. By his wounds we are healed.

Prayer after Communion:

Look with kindness upon your people, O Lord, and grant, we pray, that those you were pleased to renew by eternal mysteries may attain in their flesh the incorruptible glory of the resurrection. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Final Blessing:

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.

May God who by the resurrection of his only Son

was pleased to confer on you

the gift of redemption and of adoption

give you gladness by his blessing .

And may Almighty God bless you,

the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Go forth, the Mass is ended, alleluia. Thanks be to God alleluia.

Silent Prayer: Creator God, you have already miracled me with life and love more generously than I deserve. You have given me the power to release people from bondage, and I have not always used that power. Instead, I have held them bound. I have controlled the lives of my family and friends, manipulating them to believe as I believe. Your miracle was not enough for me because I did not see it or appreciate its worth. Help me to become ever more aware of life and love. Help me to share generously that gift and know that I am loved, warts and all. Amen.

Third Sunday of Easter B

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name, O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

In the Gospel the apostles are gathered behind closed doors, wounded in heart and spirit. But Jesus appears to them, gives them his peace, and breathes new life into them. He does the same for us.



Let us open ourselves to the gifts the risen Lord wants to give us.

Lord, you banish our doubts with the gift of faith. Lord, have mercy. You calm our fears with the gift of peace. Christ, have mercy.

You heal our wounds with your love. Lord, have mercy.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

May your people exult for ever, O God, in renewed youthfulness of spirit, so that, rejoicing now in the restored glory of our adoption, we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**
