by the passion of the Cross he freed us from unending death, and by rising from the dead he gave us life eternal. And so, with the Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The mystery of faith. Save us, Saviour of the world,

for by your Cross and Resurrection

you have set us free.

Communion Antiphon: Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood

remains in me and I in him, says the Lord.

REFLECTION

To do the work of Christ is really quite simple. It means to be faithful in little things, for to be faithful in little things is a big thing.
